## Guidelines

- 1 BOSTON: Bottom Of Something; Top Of Nothing
- 1b 4th best from 4 or more cards to an honour (J or higher)
- 2 Partner should never lead away from an Ace in a suit contract
- 3 Don't expend an honor if you surround the honour in the dummy. Ex: Dummy has Qxx; You have KTx; your KT surrounds the Q This means you have one honour higher and one honour just lower
